We ended the week with a quick recap by looking at photos of all the things we have done since the start of term and my goodness we have been busy!



Gold Class

Gold Class have done so well with addition and subtraction this term, so we are now using that knowledge to work with money. Some of our pupils are using shop role play to pay for items and are learning to recognise the coins. Other pupils have been using addition knowledge to add amounts of money. They have done investigations with money to work out different ways of making a total, for example how many ways can we make £2.00. They have also created imaginary shopping lists and added up the total cost of those items and worked out how much change they would get by counting on.

In class, pupils have been learning about connectives, which are used to join two simple sentences together. They used cards with sentence starters and endings and a word bank of connectives e.g. and, because, but, so, during, after and then built sentences that make sense.

We have really enjoyed science this term and after learning about teeth, the types and why we need to clean our teeth they have begun to plan an investigation. We decided that as we didn't have any real teeth we would find a substitute material to test in different liquids. In a fair test, we are learning that we make one change and keep everything else the same. So in this case we are changing the liquid to see which causes the most decay. We will let you know how the investigation goes next week

We loved our messy play session this week, which involved using a communication board to choose different messy activities. E.g sand/ foam etc. The foam and sand were a firm favourite! It was a good job it was homemade sand made by blending cheerios into small segments as lots of the children enjoyed tasting it!

Finally, I would like to mention this weeks Bucket Time activities. The children were really engaged in Bucket time this week and have been focusing and attending for longer periods of time. The children absolutely loved it, so it could be a fun and engaging activity to do at home as well.

FLU IMMUNISATION AT SCHOOL ON 09/10/2020

IF YOU WISH YOUR CHILD TO HAVE THE FLU IMMUNISATION AT SCHOOL, YOU MUST COMPLETE THE CONSENT FORM BY 5pm ON 06/10/2020

Oxford Health NHSFT Child Immunisation Service



The school nurse team will be coming to school on **09/10/2020** to offer the flu vaccination. School will have sent you an email with information on how to complete the online consent form to agree to your child having the immunisation in school. The consent form must be completed before the closing date to enable us to give the immunisation in school. After this date you will find the online system will not work, so please make sure you complete the form in plenty of time.

If your child has any health conditions that may affect their suitability for the nasal immunisation, the school nurse team will be contacting you by telephone to discuss. Almost all children can have the nasal flu immunisation, but we do need to ensure it is appropriate for your child.

If you would like to discuss your child's immunisation, have any questions or are having any problems with the consent form then please discuss with your nurse in school or please ring the Immunisation Administrator on 07920 254400 who will be happy to help.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION. There are some illnesses that may mean we have to delay immunising your child until they are well. If your child is unwell on the day of the immunisation but is in school, it is important you let school know and contact the school nurse team on the mobile number provided in your letter

Community Links

ASTHMA: if your child has asthma which has recently got worse, meaning they have been taking steroid

tablets in the last two weeks, or have been wheezy inhalers more than usual in the last three days then delay their immunisation.

BLOCKED NOSE: a very blocked or runny nose that unable to clear by blowing will mean we must delay immunisation.

HIGH TEMPERATURE: If your child has an infection them feel unwell and giving them a high (even if their fever has been reduced by medication then we will have to delay the immunisation.

IF YOUR CHILD IS ABSENT FROM SCHOOL OR WE ARE UNABLE TO GIVE THE IMMUNISATION.

If you have completed the consent form and your child does not have the immunisation, then we will send you information on how to book an appointment in a clinic in your area. Unfortunately, we are not able to return to school to give the immunisation. Alternatively, you may book an appointment for the flu immunisation with your child's doctor if you prefer to have the immunisation at your surgery and your GP is able to provide it.
