At the beginning of the term we started with some simple VI sessions by using high motivation light toys and songs. We have now successfully introduced bucket and sensory story to the VI sessions as it really is making a difference to our children. Eye Gaze has also been used



daily and we have seen the benefit of having worked so hard on children visual impairment with our VI sessions. We have also been working really hard on our physiotherapy. Some of our children have managed to use their walkers for long periods of time and have wonderful walks and practices around the school. Swimming was also wonderful; our swimming teacher Angela is constantly surprised with the progress of Yellow Class in the pool.

Fridays are an absolute joy with Julie, our Yellow Class children are reacting fantastically to atmospherics and massage stories by creating a wonderful and magical environment where they can relax from the hard work they have been doing during the week.



Yellow Class has concluded this week by celebrating Halloween and creating some really nice artwork. For our first piece, we painted a pumpkin and sprinkled some glitter on it. Our next piece of artwork was designing our own pumpkin and letting the children decide by choosing the eyes, mouth, stickers...that they wanted to add.

As it is last week of term, the Enterprise Group treated the staff to another Bacon Roll Day with Kayah and Sam cooking the bacon whilst Ben, Harry and Brandon sorted and lightly buttered rolls. Harry overcame his nerves and put the bacon rolls together to be wrapped in foil. Harry voiced that he was proud of himself!

We completed our topic for this term on '*Ourselves*' with thinking about all the many different relationships that people have including when we are older and might have romantic connections. We thought about appropriate touch and safe touch in our relationships and the importance of kindness.

This week Josh chose the Friday lunch – sausages, mash and gravy. The shoppers also shopped for pumpkins so the whole class could engage a little with the Halloween 'spirit' and take their carved pumpkins home.

At OXSRAD, we tried out a new warm up game called 'Beans' of which the students had to quickly replicate a certain bean i.e. runner, jumping, baked etc when the music stopped. We will see how this develops! Some students completed their final spinning session for the term with Kieren and once again the Red and Blue teams drew at Boccia. ### **Gold Class**

It has been a great week in Gold Class and pupils have continued to work with enthusiasm. We have been exploring 3D shapes and can name common 3D shapes and discuss the properties, which include the corners (vertices), edges and faces. Some pupils have gone on a 3D shape hunt around school looking for real objects to represent common 3D shapes. Others have investigated which 3D shapes roll the furthest and which stack or balance well. They have all made 3D shape skeletons using straws.





In literacy this week, some pupils have continued to describe characters from a picture book using adjectives in their sentences. Most pupils have learnt about including adverbs or adverbial phrases at the beginning of a sentence and have tried using these in their own writing.

Pupils have enjoyed swimming this week and are improving techniques and stamina with a particular focus on front crawl and back stroke. Angela has been very pleased with progress and effort in swimming lessons this term.

**Homework:** Over Half Term, it would be lovely if pupils can do plenty of reading, either of their own reading books or comics, magazines, cereal packets, newspapers etc. They can also be looking for 2D and 3D shapes in their surroundings and show off their knowledge by describing and naming them.

In maths we continued to work on colours and patterns. This week we really enjoyed using golf tees and foam. Some of us made alternating patterns and some sorted the pegs by colour.





We have been working really hard on our play skills and have made lots of progress using the toys purposefully. This week we focussed on building the train set. After lots of modelling some of us helped build the track, some attached trains together and all of us were able to push the trains around the track.



Despite the rain, we have continued to enjoy our ongoing play in the garden. Lots of us liked exploring the shaving foam whereas others enjoyed watching the parachute go up and down.

After getting to know the children throughout the first term, we have put white classes favourite things into a story. Within cooking this week, the children have been choosing what spread they would like on their muffin. Within numeracy we have been focusing on our targets, we are seeing progress already which is very promising! Within our topic lesson, we have been experimenting with different foods. Choosing what food we would like to mix together, from jelly, whipped cream, oats to spaghetti hoops. The children really enjoyed the textures and sounds whilst mixing the foods together. Within art this week, we finished our Halloween display board, by adding apple printing 'pumpkins' and adding eyes and a mouth on each 'pumpkin'.

For PE this week, we have been swimming with Angela, half of the class becoming more confident in the water, and half of the class are working on raising their arms outside of the water when doing the front crawl. During the tennis lesson this week, we have been working on hand-eye coordination, aiming and throwing the small blue ball to the big blue ball, throwing bean bags into hoops and increasing the distance from the target. White class have been scored for the pentathlon; we will find out their scores when we get back after half term!
