


Blue Class

Gold Class

Term 2 has started well in Gold Class. Pupils have had a good week with a variety of subjects covered. We have enjoyed learning about the history of Guy Fawkes and the reason that we celebrate 5th November. Pupils wrote lovely poems to include some description about fireworks and they have done some of their own research using search engines to find out interesting facts about Guy Fawkes himself. We have also done some work around Remembrance Day and WW1 in school. This has involved some artwork, reading poetry and diaries of WW1 soldiers to understand what life was like. They have been asking lots of good questions while learning about WW1. Some pupils have gone on to write a diary as if they were a soldier experiencing the trenches in the war, which will part of the school Remembrance display.


In science we will be learning about light and sound this term and we began with talking about light and dark, different light sources and why we need light to see things. Pupils are getting more confident at counting in 5s, 10s or 3s and linking these to times tables. A few pupils are estimating amounts and then counting to see how accurate they are.











Homework: Please read and talk about the books and practise counting in 5s, 10s or 3s. You could also have a go at estimating amounts around the home e.g. how many sweets in the jar, apples in the bowl and then check the accuracy of the estimate by counting?

Silver Class

It's been great to see all the children back, full of energy and well rested, after the half term break. We have been busy thinking about our new topic 'Lets Celebrate'.

We started this term thinking about how different people might chose to celebrate Halloween. We have been exploring our first story 'Meg and Mog'. We really enjoyed wearing the witches' hat and wig as well as flying on the broom. We also liked playing with the toy mouse that Meg turned her friends into and trying the strawberries that she put in her potion. Our favourite though was definitely mixing our own potions using coloured water and creepy creatures. We followed up the story with some symbol work as well as some mark making.



In art we continued our 'Meg and Mog' theme by choosing different decorations to make our witches hat and in cooking we made ice cream cone witches hats using melted chocolate and sprinkles. Again, we all practised using communication boards and symbols to make choice about decorations. We also enjoyed our messy play session where we explored slimy jelly with eyeballs in.



In maths we have been working on our number skills. Some of us have been working on showing anticipation and joining in with number songs. Others have been working on 1:1 matching and counting out amounts to 5 and some of us have started to work on some adding using objects.

We were lucky this week to take part in an online music for autism session. We enjoyed listening to the flute and ukulele being played and enjoyed playing our own instruments alongside the music. We were all fascinated by seeing ourselves and our friends on the video call.







We have also carried on with our weekly swimming, dance and PE sessions. Our highlight was our parachute games in PE where everyone joined in. We loved being under the parachute and watching it move up and down and well as sitting on top and being spun and pulled.

White Class

Happy Friday everyone!

It's been a very productive week for white class!

Our topic for this term is light and sound. In numeracy this week, we have been looking at capacity, focusing on more and less, and small and big. We have been size ordering pumpkins, taking part in water play to explore more and less water and we have also been categorising big and small. Within literacy we are focusing on Halloween. We have been reading Room on the Broom by Julia Donaldson. The children have really enjoyed exploring the sensory props, such as the puppets, the witch's hat, the broom and the ingredients for the potion. The children have been matching the props within the story to symbols. Some have even moved onto describing the props, for example black witches hat.

Within Topic lessons, we have been mixing potions, just like the witch does in 'Room on the Broom', the children have been choosing what messy play items to add into their potion and mix it with a spoon. In art we have been decorating witches hats with items we can sick on, the children have been requesting what item they would like to decorate the hat with using a communication board. In our cooking classes, we have been decorating ice cream cones to create their own witches hat, choosing what edible items to decorate with.

Within PE this week, we have been swimming with Angela, half of the class becoming more confident in the water, and half of the class working on using raising their arms outside of the water when doing the front crawl. We have found that no music is helping the children feel at ease within the water! During the tennis lesson this week, we have been working on agility and hand-eye coordination, holding onto bean bags/rackets and moving in and out of cones. In the games session, we have been working on our aim, throwing bean bags into coloured hoops, kicking footballs to knock over other footballs and throwing bean bags at balls to knock them off a bench.

Our topic this half term is 'Light and Sound' with a specific focus on 'celebrations.' In Literacy this week, we started our new story 'Room on a Broom' which was a real success. The children seemed to really enjoy the new sensory props and did some fantastic mark making and sensory exploration afterwards.

We linked our Cooking and Art to our new story this week. We made witches hats in cooking using an upside down ice cream cone and melted chocolate. We added sprinkles and sweets as decorations. The children were very good at following simple symbol recipes. Their highlight was definitely eating the end product! In Art this week, we chose different materials to decorate a witch's hat. The children were very









creative and practiced using communication boards to make their requests.

In Numeracy we have been focusing on measurement and capacity. Some of us have been comparing using the terms 'full' and 'empty' whilst some us have been using non standard units of measurement to indicate capacity.

In Science this week we have been focusing on sound. To introduce our new topic, we explored different sound toys and explored how to make the toys make noise. Some of us were able to use a communication board to comment whether they were loud or quiet.
