Blue Class

Good afternoon all, I hope you have had a good week. Blue Class have enjoyed a very 'hands-on' time, working on capacity in Maths, sound in Science and 'Room on the Broom' in literacy.



Working on capacity in maths was great fun as pupils made their own potions just like the witch in the class story. Through this we discussed 'full, empty and half full' and sorted containers by capacity using non-standard units of measure (e.g. cups/cubes).



In literacy we used 'colourful semantics' to promote sentence construction at different levels for all pupils in class. Pupils chose an object and verb (as well as subject and location for some pupils) and

used a colour coded mat to string them together into different sentences. We also worked on our mark making and handwriting skills, improving our fine motor control.

Science was exciting as we investigated the different sorts of sounds that instruments make and practiced loud/quiet, long/short, fast/slow. Swimming was also a real success for all pupils as they worked with Angela and Sarah, remembering to use all four of their limbs, practicing kicking with floats and long reaching with their arms.

We're glad for a couple of days to relax but look forwards to seeing you all again for more fun on Monday

Purple Class

This week we have inevitably focussed on Remembrance Day and proudly placed our class wreath on the Common Room door. We looked at some footage of the London Blitz with the sound of sirens. Harry said, *'it makes my eyes water'*. We looked at a PowerPoint which explained all about why we have Remembrance Day and watched a video of the Queen laying her wreath surrounded by veterans at the Cenotaph whilst 'the Last Post' played. We then donated to the appeal and wore our poppies. It was good preparation for the two minute silence on the 11th.

For Art we have focussed on creating kindness hands for the Kindness Tree. Students drew around their hands with and without support and decorated them by choice. Chan even managed to squeeze in making a special birthday card for Daddy. Finally, the students chose a kindness heart which read something kind for their hands. We all had a 'Kindness Challenge Sheet' and had to tick off acts of kindness. All acts passed!

We continued with our topic of 'Light & Sound'. This week we recapped on Darkness being the absence of light and thought of some different light sources, some natural like the sun and stars and some that have to be made like a torch. Students were very good at deciding which light sources were made. Matthew was great at signing Light House, sun and stars.

Ben chose this week's lunch and Ben, Brandon and Kayah supported by Mary helped with arranging the online shopping at Tesco. Once again, the students worked together to work out what we needed to buy and decide on how many of the items we would need. Other students worked hard on their targets. Sam



did his Maths work on the laptop this week mostly independent and Harry surprised Gill with counting to 100. Students *really* enjoyed the Shopping Game lead by Dawn (who happens to have a secret pot of sweets for good work).

As it was also 'World Kindness Day' this Thursday, Brandon, Sam, Robbie and Matthew started to paint the 'Kindness Tree' which will have pride place in the main school corridor – watch this space! Ben, Ceri, Chan and Josh prepared and cooked the Friday lunch – sausages, mash, peas and gravy. Josh and Ceri also joined Clare for some music in the Light Room. Gold Class

Gold Class have had an excellent week. On Wednesday we marked Remembrance Day with a 2-minute silence and on Friday we could wear something red to help support the Poppy Appeal.

The RWI (phonics and reading groups) are going well with pupils learning to cooperate and work together in small groups. They are making progress in reading, comprehension and spelling and are working at improving grammar and punctuation. Our maths focus this week has been on developing mental maths skills. Pupils have been using known addition and subtraction facts, working with number bonds, adding and subtracting multiples of ten or near multiples of ten. Their confidence and ability in mental maths has developed over the week and they are learning new strategies. We investigated which materials are more reflective in science this week and then thought about our conclusion. We also enjoyed learning about Diwali by listening to the story of Rama and Sita, making clay Diwali lamps and drawing Rangoli patterns.



Homework: Please read and talk about the book's pupils are reading as always. Pupils could make a list of all of the different sources of light that they see over the weekend and they could research a nocturnal animal.

Silver Class

We've had another good week in Silver Class exploring how we might celebrate Halloween.

We have continued with our story 'Meg and Mog' We enjoyed exploring flying on the broomstick as well as making feathers and tissue paper fly using different fans. As a follow up some of us practised making different patterns in paint, some practised tracing patterns and others practised ordering and writing our name.



In other areas of literacy, we have continued with our phonics. Some of us are recognising different sounds, some are matching and sorting letters and some are starting to spell different 3 letter words. We are all making lots of progress.





In cooking this week, we continued with practising following instructions to make spider biscuits. We are getting better at looking at each step at a time or imitating what the adult is doing. We also had 2 art lessons this week using our communication boards and symbols. In one we chose different materials to decorate our poppies and in the other chose different items to decorate our witches' capes. Our favourite decoration was definitely glitter.



The highlight of the week, as always, was messy play. We loved making potions using food colouring and shaving foam bubbles. We did lots of splatting, mixing and stirring and had lots of fun.

White Class

Happy Friday everyone!

It's been another brilliant week for white class!

Our topic for this term is light and sound. In numeracy this week, we have continued looking at capacity, focusing on small and big. The children are doing really well at categorising big and small objects we have around the school, for example, drums, balls, chairs etc. Within literacy we are focusing on Halloween. We have been reading Room on the Broom by Julia Donaldson. The children love playing with the sensory props, such as the puppets, the witch's hat, the broom and the ingredients for the potion. The children have been matching the witch's clothes together in symbols, requesting different coloured jelly from the witch's potion, choosing what items to put into the potion through a communication board and mixing it all up.

In art we have been decorating paper plate poppies with all things red. Our poppies have been put up on the Remembrance Day display board. We have also decorated our handprints for a kindness tree, this is for world kindness day, and our handprints will join the rest of the schools to create leaves for the tree. White class staff have chosen and written a kind word that we think best describe each of the children. It was so hard to pick just one word! White class have finished our school Halloween display board, it contains a witch's hat which is decorated with arts and crafts, apple printing pumpkins and paper plate spiders (see photo below).

Within PE this week, we have been swimming with Angela, half of the class becoming more confident in the water, and half of the class are still working on using raising their arms outside of the water when doing the front crawl. In the game's session, we have been becoming confident working on our aim, throwing bean bags into coloured hoops, kicking footballs to knock over other footballs and throwing bean bags at balls to knock them off a bench. Within dance, we had a dance party, dancing to Disney songs and the children's favourite songs.
