
**Blue Class**

Our aim was to make sure that all of our letters, shapes and patterns were the same size with some finger spaces in between. We have been working on shapes in maths. The children are becoming really confident at naming 2D and 3D shapes. Our focus has been counting sides and edges, faces and surfaces and corners or vertices. They are beginning to remember the tricky vocabulary and learning how to count these parts of the shape. It has been a real challenge to only count each property once but they are definitely improving.

As it was the beginning of December the children enjoyed decorating the class Christmas tree. Two naughty elves seem to have joined the class and have already encouraged the children to make paper snowballs to have a snowball fight with and made snow angels in big heaps of Rice Krispies!! Watch out for more cheeky elf stories. The classroom is also looking very sparkly and glittery, every art activity at the moment seems to include glitter, glue and lots of twinkly bits.

It has been an exciting week in Silver Class this week as we have been starting to think about Christmas. We also started our new Christmas sensory story 'We are going on an elf chase' and really enjoyed exploring all the props from the story, we especially liked eating the candy floss snow and meeting the soft toy elf from the story.

In maths this week we started thinking about sorting and stacking. Some children were working on stacking bricks or rings, some sorted items by colour and others sorted by more complex categories such as where animals live.









In art this week we enjoyed choosing items to decorate Christmas trees for our Christmas cards. We are doing so well practising using our symbols and communication boards to both make requests and comment on our artwork. In cooking this week, we made mince pies and jam tarts. The children did so well following the picture instructions to make these as independently as possible. I have included some pictures from the poppadom's last week as the children did so well chopping, stirring and grating.









We have also been really proud of the children in PE. Some of us have been practising our walking skills. Most of us can now walk along a sloped bench and some can even jump over items on the bench. We are also getting braver at jumping from higher benches and really enjoyed crawling on the benches through the tunnel this week.

This Friday we enjoyed exploring Christmas snowy messy play with shaving foam, pinecones and snowflakes. We all are getting really stuck in with our messy play and really exploring in different ways. Last week we enjoyed the flour messy play and especially enjoyed sprinkling and blowing the flour across the room.

### **White Class**

Happy end of lockdown!

During literacy this week we are focusing on Christmas. We have been reading a sensory story called Charlie's Christmas. Within the story we learn about Christmas traditions, such as decorating the Christmas tree, carol singing, going to church, advent calendars, writing Christmas letters to Father Christmas and making cards for friends and family. It was amazing to see the children's eyes light up when they saw the Father Christmas doll. The children really enjoyed the part of the story where they all had a bauble and decorated the Christmas tree. The children have also been matching symbols of Christmas items to pictures some children have even been describing the objects e.g. colourful Christmas tree and loud singing.

We have linked arts and crafts with Christmas this week, creating sticking and gluing decorations on our mini Christmas tree's to hang up on our class Christmas tree (see photo below). The children loved decorating the tree, we even had our morning dance around the tree! During cooking, we were following instructions on how to cook mince pies, the children loved having some pastry! Within numeracy we have been sorting different things into categories, this week we were concentrating on sorting colours, and sorting by numbers, depending on dice, digits, objects etc. Within Phonic's and mark making we have been working on the letter T, the children have loved learning about this, exploring the TV, telephone, trains and tractors.
