Pupils have very much enjoyed attention bucket sessions this week. Each session starts with a song and then progresses on with three separate stages – the 'attention grabber', 'attention builder'

and 'turn taking'. Our attention-grabbing items this week included an 'ACME siren', springing frog and gloop-squirting animal'! The attention builder involved printing paint onto paper to decorate a Christmas tree and pupils sieved flour over card hoof-prints in the turn taking activity.

All pupils have taken turns reading with staff at least twice this week and good progress has been observed across the board in communication sessions.

During literacy this week we have been focusing on Christmas. We have continued reading the story Charlie's Christmas. The children have become familiar with the story and the props. They have been describing toys that they might receive at Christmas, for example a soft teddy, a fast scooter or a loud guitar. During mark making, we have been colouring in Christmas themed drawings such as stockings, the children are working hard trying to remember the correct grip.
