
Students are enjoying practising their social dance routines and are beginning to pick up the moves! We might make our own video so watch this space!

Our topic this term is 'Keeping Healthy' so we have been learning a song all about fruit and vegetables. We are then going to change and improve some of the describing words in the song and write our own version. My favourite was Holly's idea: Instead of using 'strawberries sweet,' she wanted to describe them as 'squidgy'. As part of this, we have also been preparing and tasting different fruits and vegetables. When we were cutting the Honeydew melon Charlie said that he didn't like it. However, he was very brave and tried a little piece and loved it. He had 2 more helpings – well done Charlie.

In maths, we are learning all about money and coins. We have found it quite tricky but David spotted the picture of the £50 note straight away and could tell us that this was the picture of the most money – well done David, a very important skill.

Camron has also really impressed us this week with his reading skills. He played a phonics game with his friends on Thursday and managed to concentrate for 30 minutes and read all the words on his card with great confidence.

We have also found a fantastic website with the children: <u>www.starfall.com</u> – where they can practise their reading skills. Read the sentence and then listen to it to see if they got it right. Alternatively, listen to the sentence and have a go at reading it out loud. Henry discovered that the pictures were interactive too. So when you press on the characters or objects they move or change colour. They all really enjoyed this activity.

Happy Friday everyone and a Happy Mother's Day to all the White Class Mothers! I hope the boys treat you with cuddles, games and laughter!

Within Literacy this week, we have started reading 'Oliver's fruit salad'. The children have been tasting, smelling, touching, listening and looking at different fruits and matching them to pictures in symbol lessons. In mark making lessons, the children have been using their tripod grip to create letters and patterns around fruit on the paper. During cooking and topic, we have been making a fruit salad, following instructions, and tasting each fruit, commenting on how it smells/looks/feels with our communication boards, the berries were a favourite by a mile! Within Phonics we have been going over SAPTIN to ensure the children are confident what they have previously learnt, we have also been identifying instruments and environmental sounds.

In art, we have been making Mother's Day cards and choosing stamps to use, and colours to dip it in, to print onto paper, creating our own artwork. Within PE, we have been doing a sensory circuit every morning, which the children love, swimming lessons we have been focusing on our confidence and arm movements, and in dance we have been dancing under the parachute, with Gina.

P.E this week has been brilliant! We have been practicing our ball skills in the hall by rolling, bouncing and passing the ball to each other. Another group of children have been taking part in a small group yoga class which they seemed to really enjoy.
