

#### **Gold Class**

We are getting into a good routine in Gold Class. It has been a busy week full of activities and learning. If there are any Duke of Edinburgh booklets still at home, can pupils please bring in the booklet so that we can begin to sign off skills and activities towards the award. Pupils are learning a new skill, doing a physical activity and volunteering towards the award. The skill is being done in school, the physical activity assessment is swimming and pupils all have volunteering jobs and roles within school. However, they may like to do more volunteering and 'helping out' at home to support this. At the moment, there are no expeditions planned (partly due to restrictions) and we will give you plenty of notice if we intend to do anything like this. There is no need to purchase any clothing or equipment for this right now.

In topic lessons, pupils in Gold class were interested to learn about the way milk was sent from the farm to supermarket. They learnt a little about the milking stage and dairy before milk is bottled up. They are getting more confident at finding places on a map of the UK. We have been doing maths lessons with money this week and it is always good to practice recognition of coins and notes and adding up amounts of money.

On Thursday, we enjoyed cooking omelettes and most pupils at least tasted them. They had a choice of fillings – the cheese and ham were very popular and some pupils also had fried red pepper. We then wrote a recipe for making an omelette in class and pupils were good at remembering the method that they used in the cooking room. They also used lots of time connectives to order the recipe with clear numbered steps.







The girls had a good swimming session on Monday. Unfortunately, the boys' session was cancelled this week as the pool was out of action. We have needed to change the swimming timetable slightly and so boys and girls will swim on a Thursday from now on, but still in separate sessions.

#### **White Class**

Happy Friday everyone!

Within Literacy this week, we have continued reading 'Oliver's fruit salad'. The children have been tasting, smelling, touching, listening and looking at different fruits and describing the fruits appearance and texture in our symbols lesson. In mark making lessons, the children have continued to use their tripod grip to create letters and patterns around fruit on the paper. During cooking, we made a banana split, following step by step instructions, peeling the banana, scooping the ice cream, spraying the whipped cream, sprinkling chocolate sprinkles, squeezing the strawberry sauce and then describing how it smells, looks, feels and tastes! In topic we have been feeling the textures of tinned fruit and commenting on it, we got really messy, but clearly stated we prefer fresh fruit! In science, we have been planting seeds! After digging and sprinkling the seeds, the children really enjoyed watering the plants with a watering can.

Within Phonics we have been spelling CVC words from SATPIN, the students are doing really well, and we have also been identifying instruments and environmental sounds. In art, we have choosing stamps to use, and colours to dip it in, to print onto paper, creating our own artwork, were getting really good at raising our hand up to press the stamp on the paper. Within PE, we have been doing a sensory circuit every morning, swimming lessons we have been focusing on our confidence and arm movements, and in dance we have been dancing under the parachute, with Gina.
