### **Purple Class**


The penultimate week of Term 5 has been as busy as usual and students in Purple have produced some fabulous work once again. The Communication Group concentrated on 'feelings' and how to recognise in others how someone might be feeling. We tried to replicate how we thought a certain feeling might look and took photos of ourselves to use as resources. Perhaps you can guess the feeling?







We then shared an e-book story of 'all around the world'. Students have also worked hard on their letter and shape formation and are really beginning to focus.







The Enterprise Group attempted cooking the perfect boiled egg with soldiers (*not an easy task*) and enjoyed tasting their attempts!









This week for our topic work 'The Environment' we looked more closely at our world 'Planet Earth'. We found out a little about continents and oceans and looked at how we could recognise different countries by their shape. Students colour coded and labelled their world maps with country symbols.







Kayah chose Friday lunch – Spaghetti Bolognese with garlic bread and students worked together to decide what ingredients we would need. Students continued with their individual target work and the focus this week has been on money. Sam and Harry have worked hard on counting money in tens and students are really starting to familiarise with all the coins. Harry counted in tens by himself!

We have looked at the work of some French artists, namely Mondrian and Monet and students have attempted to replicate some famous pieces in the style of these French artists. We have some fabulous art to display and Headteacher Lorraine is lucky to have a special piece of art created by Jakob to display in her office!







Iqra also worked at typing up her email to send out to staff for her presentation research although she was a little camera shy!



At OXSRAD this week the spinning class was inside the dance studio due to the weather. Students worked really hard at following the coach's instructions and we also had a team's game of Boccia which as you will see was very close indeed as students are definitely improving their skills at rolling the ball near to

the Jack! Josh is becoming quite the expert!





Students worked on asking questions and answering in full sentences supported with signs.

In maths, we have been exploring fractions, understanding what the whole is and dividing it into equal pieces. We found half of 2D shapes and labelled each part. We cut play food in half and continued to role play this in the kitchen area. Some children explored quarters and knew that we had cut a whole one into 4 equal pieces.

### **Red Class**

What terrible weather we are having for May! However, as you can see from the photograph some of the children in Red Class have really enjoyed playing in the rain and the puddles. It was quite exciting when our play area flooded, they put on their wellies and went to explore. It has been quite a messy week altogether. We are learning about capacity in maths and have been filling containers with lots of water, flour, oats and pasta. The children have been practising 'full', 'half-full', 'empty', 'nearly-full' and 'nearly empty' if you would like to have a go at home. I think everybody's favourite substance was flour; they all looked like snowmen at one point. One of the children discovered the sieve and how to make the flour look like snow and sprinkled it all over themselves like a snowstorm — it was great fun.

We have also been busy story writing, our book Rosie's Walk has been very interesting, if you just read the words, it is all about a hen called Rosie. If you look at the pictures, there is a sneaky fox in every picture. The challenge this week was to rewrite the story using verbs and including sentences about the fox. The children enjoyed this and commented that it was a bit like a 'Tom and Jerry' cartoon where the fox was trying to be mean but kept having accidents.

There has also been a great deal of phonics practise going on. We have loaded some new games and activities onto the computers and the children have been very keen to have a go and see how well they can do against each other. Keep up the good work Red Class!

#### **Gold Class**

This week has flown by! Gold Class have enjoyed describing and naming shapes both 2D and 3D shapes. They have also been looking for shapes in everyday objects and maybe you could ask them to spot cubes, cuboids or even hexagons around the home.

In swimming lessons, students are practising for the Pentathlon and doing various timed events in the pool, such as a timed speed swim and diving down for objects to place in a hoop. They also learnt some personal survival skills. They had to shout for help, then preserve their energy by relaxing into a starfish shape, tread water and do the HELP position in the water (a way to keep heat in the body if swimming in cold water). This is a very important safety technique to practise.









This week, we used satellite photos of the local area to create collages, which was great fun. Students looked carefully at the features on the photograph and thought about colours and textures when they chose the resources for their collages.



We have worked as a class to create a plan of the school field. We used an outline template and used photographs of different areas within the playground to begin to place them accurately in the correct positions for a plan. We discussed compass directions to move the photographs around and place them in the correct position on the field template. Some students then added extra information on the plan and we will be thinking about symbols that we could use for different features on the map/plan.

#### White Class

Happy Friday everyone!

We have started to read 'There's a Shark in the Park'. We have created sentences using symbols from the story, e.g. the boy is looking through a telescope. We have also been identifying items with symbols. During mark making we have been colouring in our own telescopes for our class display. In maths, we have been learning about numbers counting to 5, 10, 15 and 20 and using the numbers in a functional way. We have also been working on patterns, with colours, shapes, and size. Within Phonics we have been working on the letter K and we have also been identifying instruments and environmental sounds.

In art we have been creating our own parks through junk modelling and play dough shaping. In cooking this week, we made our own ice cream cones, scooping the ice cream into the cone, grating the chocolate, and sprinkling it on top and choosing strawberry or chocolate sauce. In topic we have been looking at park, the children are getting better at sorting emotions, they are also loving looking at themselves in the mirror, some are able to express emotions in the mirror now! Within PE, we have been doing a sensory circuit every morning, in swimming lessons we have been working on our swimming technique and confidence! On Thursday we had a party for Jemma and Ali's birthday, we choose which snacks and drinks we wanted and songs to dance and sing to (mainly Frozen songs).
