Swimming sessions have served as a weekly highlight for all the children in Yellow Class. Felix has loved his weekly swim. All the children work so hard with their physio targets when in the pool. We have seen some super stretching as well as splashing in the swimming pool this term. Our weekly yoga sessions have also provided another excellent opportunity for the children to work on their physio programmes. Well done Yellow class.

Communication is ongoing throughout the day, but in our specific communication sessions, we have seen some really pleasing work from all the children and we have continued to be impressed by their efforts. A special mention must go to Sienna, who looked at me and smiled, as she shook my hand. This was a wonderful moment, and we were all so proud of her. Some of the children have been using communication boards and they are serving as a source of real intrigue. Francesca is starting to show an interest in the communication board, particularly when she can ask for bubbles and her baby doll. Super work.

We have had some super Sensory cooking sessions, where we have seen excellent engagement from the children. Ada enjoyed operating the switch, to turn on the food mixer. Willow showed great concentration in these sessions and used her foot to enable her to operate the switch, that turned on the food mixer. Alessandra loved feeling the flour being sprinkled onto her hands and she tolerated a noisy food mixer. Well done girls.

Our friends from Trinity Church have led some terrific singing sessions with Yellow Class this term. Roman was captivated by the singing and he sat on his chair, whilst listening to the songs. There was also lots of lovely vocalising from the children during our singing sessions. Our friends from Trinity Church have been very impressed by the warm reception that they always receive from the children in Yellow class.

During hand function work Isla and Habibou did super looking and mark making by independently moving their hands through the flour. We were so impressed by how well they focused when doing their mark making-amazing!

Pink Class

It's been a wonderful term for us all in Pink class with everyone engaging with all the festivities connected to our 'celebrations' topic. We have enjoyed experiencing the lights, smells and sounds associated with each festival. We loved the 'bang' of the party poppers recreating the sounds and the colours of the fireworks, the smells, tastes and textures exploring different foods and spices during our sensory cooking, exploration and story sessions and listening to different music surrounding the festivals. In cooking we enjoyed making a mango lassi during Diwali and more recently helping to mix and explore the ingredients for our Christmas cakes.

There has been continued progress during our communication sessions this term, especially

during 'hellos'. We are focusing on using

communication topic boards in all activities to make choices by either looking at or touching the 'I want' symbol and the symbol or symbols of our choice. Some of us are doing this confidently and independently when shown the topic board. Some of us are also recognizing our visual timetable to understand what we are doing now and next.

We have enjoyed our hand function maths sessions and singing action songs to show body awareness. We have successfully been working on our spacial awareness skills, through activities such as moving different sized and shaped objects from one space to another and in and out of containers, locating switches to create an effect and placing shapes into form board puzzles.

We have all been working hard on our physio targets and making lots of effort in our PE sessions. We have loved taking turns to play skittles and there are lots of smiles when we knock them down. Passing a balloon to each other is also a firm favourite activity, as well as parachute games where we love the feel of the breeze as we sit under the parachute as it floats up and down in the air. There were lots of laughing when we put our cuddly class crocodile on top of the parachute and took turns trying to catch it. We love exploring the PE equipment, such as the sensory tunnel as part of our circuit work. In swimming we are continuing to work hard on our targets and focusing on achieving them. A new activity for us this term has been weekly yoga session. Everyone has been really engaged during the sessions and shown good awareness of different parts of our bodies. Our firm favourite part of each session being the smell of the lavender oil and listening to the soft sound of the chimes. We are all so relaxed at the end of each session it takes several minutes before anyone moves!









Music has been a lovely focus for us this term. We have listened to music associated with the different celebrations, such as Diwali dance music and Christmas carols and songs surrounding Christmas. Added to this we have been lucky to have Trinity Choir visiting us once a week. Our class piano continues to be a great success and we enjoy using our free time to sit and play music together and listen to each other playing as well.

Some of our children have celebrated birthdays this term and we have found out about bonfire night and Diwali too. Gold Class

Gold Class have enjoyed exploring our topic this term— The Weather. Pupils have looked at weather reports and forecasts and recognise the symbols that are used in a digital weather forecast. They have monitored our own weather by recording daily temperatures and measuring rainfall. They worked in pairs to create a weather forecast, which we video recorded.

They have also learnt lots about the difference between hot and cold countries around the World. They realise that the colder climates are near the North or South Pole and the hotter climates are closer to the Equator. We have looked at maps and a globe to find some of these countries. We have used Meercat Mail, a lovely picture to introduce finding information about a desert and finding out which animals can live there. We also looked at a book about Ernest Shackleton, who explored the polar regions and travelled from pole to pole in snowy, icy conditions. Many pupils know some differences between Arctic and Antarctica. They all made a climate model in a shoe box with some pupils choosing to create a polar scene and a few did a desert or rainforest in a box.

Our maths lessons have been great this term. We have been doing calculations, fractions, measuring and telling the time.

We have completed our 3 months doing soft archery, which has been great fun. Students have also had the opportunity to try something new recently by joining a yoga class this term. Gold Class have really enjoyed this and have been learning yoga poses and balances followed by a relaxation at the end of the session.

Cooking has remained a favourite in our Class and we have continued to make things that they could do at home and make for lunch or a snack e.g. pizza, pasta or toasted sandwiches.

In music this term we have been focussing on percussion and for our Christmas performance we have been singing songs from the 60s, 70s and 80s, which you will get to see in the filmed performance.

During our art lessons this term we have been exploring different kinds of patterns called Rangoli patterns, these are a huge part of the Diwali festival and the children have worked carefully to reproduce the patterns and stay inside the lines, keeping their painting neat and focused.

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Silver Class

News from Communication Pathway







During term 2 the children enjoyed making lots of different snacks during cooking. We made firework cookies, Indian sweets, dreidel pastries, marshmallow snowman sticks and cornflake Christmas puddings. The children needed to follow the instructions to make each tasty snack – the best part was eating them of course!







One of our favourite parts of the week is listening to our sensory story. The children enjoy immersing themselves in the various sensory resources whilst hearing the story. We then engage the children in activities relating to the story, with strong links to their communication targets.

This term the children have enjoyed focusing on these stories; 'Festival of Colours' (a story with a Holi/Diwali theme), 'The Hannukah Mice' (a story with a Hannukah theme), 'Aliens love Panta Claus' and 'Dear Santa' (our most recent Christmas theme!) One of their favourite parts of 'Dear Santa' was the hidden flaps which reveal a present on each page... this made us very excited for Christmas!









Art is one of our favourite things to do in silver class and the children have created some fantastic masterpieces this term relating to our 'Communities and Celebrations' topic. We have made firework straw art by blobbing paint onto black paper and blowing through a straw to spread it around. We have created paper plate Diya's, spinning top paint pictures, lollipop stick Stars of David, Salt dough decorations and Christmas cards. Lots of these lovely pieces of art are coming home in the final week so that you are able to celebrate your child's wonderful work with them. During these art lessons the children are able to choose the resources and colours they would like to use to enable them to practise their communication. It also supports their fine motor skills development and it is great to see them feeling proud of something they have created.







In term 2 silver class took part of lots of messy, sensory play activities including coloured icing swirls, painting bread with food colouring, lentil/rice play, herb scented playdough, snow messy play and candy cane gloop with cornflour. One of their favourite and most engaging activities was playing with ice cubes. The children enjoyed holding them in their hands, eating them, making them melt and adding food colouring to them. We talked about how they were very cold and what happens when you warm up the ice.

We have had a wonderful term in silver class and would like to wish all of our friends and families a very happy Christmas and a happy, healthy new year!

White Class

It's been a busy and productive term, our topic has been communities and celebrations, the children have learnt a lot and shown interest in this topic and have really enjoyed learning about the celebration's different communities have.

Within communication lesson, we have been challenging the children to observe, request and for some, comment on objects/actions within different activities, such as bubbles, pop up pirate and press and go musical toys. Within Literacy, we have been reading festival of colours, The Hannukah Mice, Alien loves Santa paws and Dear Santa. Within these stories we have been looking at how different communities celebrate special events such as Holi, Hannukah and Christmas. Within literacy lessons, we have been requesting props, identifying pictures within the story book, tracing and copying key words within the story and mark making using different tools. We have linked topic lessons to literacy lessons, exploring the herbs and typical food eaten in these celebrations, powder play, spin the dreidel, making Christmas decorations and having a Christmas party. Within numeracy lessons, we have been focusing on time, numbers, positional and comparative language. The children have been improving and becoming more confident within each lesson.

The children have been enjoying their PE lessons, completing sensory circuits, experiencing alerting, organising, and calming sections. The children have enjoyed dance with Gina, experiencing warmups and cool downs, within the lesson focusing on actions and repeating them. During swimming lessons with Angela, the children have been focusing on completing skills on the Learn to Swim stage 1-7 awards curriculum. The children have also been working hard to produce some great videos for the Christmas play. We can't wait for you to watch it; we hope you are as pleased with it as we are!

The children have been making amazing pieces of artwork, they have been blowing through straws to make firework straw art, painting and decorating paper plate Diya's, Christmas paper plates, salt dough Christmas decorations, lollipop stick star of David, dreidel spinning top paint splatters and Christmas cards. During cooking lessons, we have been following instructions to make a dish which could be eaten during the celebration we are learning about, we have made marshmallow snowman, cornflake Christmas pudding, cake pop bauble, dreidel pastries, Indian sweets, and firework cookies.

In Numeracy this term we continued to work on number, counting and calculation as well as our understanding of time in simple terms. We explored 'more' and 'less' using different resources.

Topic this term was lots of fun and we explored food associated with different celebrations. We tasted, smelt, and explored different spices as part of Diwali, latkes as park of Hannukah and mince pies when learning about Christmas. The children practiced using communication boards to comment and build opinions. We certainly heard 'yummy' and 'I like it' when tasting the special Christmas chocolates and gingerbread men.

In Art we made a variety of different pieces associated to different celebrations. We made diya lamps, rangoli patterns, menorah, driedels and a whole variety of Christmas related crafts. In Cooking we made foods related to different celebrations including Indian sweets, dreidel pastries and marshmallow snowman. Everyone in Black Class have become very good at following visual recipes. Well done everyone



This term we have been using the zones of regulation to talk about our feelings. I want to make a special mention for everyone in Black Class. We have been using the zones of regulation twice daily to indicate how we are feeling. Some children are even beginning to comment on why they feel a certain way. Now that we have spent a whole term together, we are seeing new friendships form and Black Class's play skills are improving.

On a final note, we were lucky enough to have a special visit from Elfy the elf who came to check we were working hard. He made sure that we completed our work, followed instructions and played nicely together. After spending all of December with us, he sent us a special letter today.
