The children were also amazing choosing different props to put on the resonance board and explored all the different sounds they were making. During our Art activities this week we all enjoyed making some beautiful autumn wreaths using leaves, paper plate and glue. Our students really liked the sound that the leaves were making as they were touching and squeezing them in their hands.



We have had a fun week to end the term. Children have really enjoyed activities that have focussed on Autumn and Halloween. We have used a short spooky story with sensory input and lots of participation and then we used phonics skills to spell out some simple words in the story. Children cut out 2D shapes and used them to make a witch, which we will send home on Friday. Most children enjoyed scooping out a large pumpkin in class (with a couple of reluctant onlookers watching but interested.) We collected lots of Autumn leaves on the school field and used some of them to make lovely leaf hedgehogs. Some of the leaves were also used in maths with the pumpkin seeds for counting and simple addition.





In gymnastics this week, we had lots of equipment out and it was very exciting to explore the apparatus, climbing ladders, balancing and jumping off apparatus. It is brilliant to see how much confidence has grown over the term on these skills.




