We have had a very busy but amazing week in Green Class. It was really nice to see some of our students' parents and carers joining us for the Poppy appeal coffee morning last Friday and sharing with us some delicious cakes.

Using the resonance board to say 'good morning' to our friends on Monday morning has started being one of our firm favourites in Green Class. We have been encouraging and supporting our students to use their communication boards, IPads and POOD books to request if they would like to make quiet or loud sounds during the session. It has been great to see the children looking and paying attention as the members of staff model words for them and support them to use the different means of communication. During our hand function session this week, the children loved shaking the balloons with rice in them using one hand or both and they were great playing turn taking games with the adults or their friends, by pushing balls or cars to each other. Some of the students also did some great hand physio exercises with adult support. The children were great stretching their arms, opening their hands and getting their fingers ready for the session.

In our sensory circuits this week, the children worked very well on their physical development, communication and maths targets. Some of our students were amazing counting the Curling stones and pushing them down to the ramp independently. We have also had great intensive interactions with our students during the session and it was so nice seeing them participating actively in all the different activities. In Arts this week the children made some shiny fireworks using pieces from carton boxes, different texture fabrics, tissue paper, paper cards and glue. The children did some great choosing between the different materials and particularly enjoyed tearing the tissue paper into small pieces and sticking them on their fireworks.

Red Class


This week we have welcomed Seb into our class! He has coped really well with the new routines and all the other children have been very friendly and welcoming.

In literacy we sequenced stories, including our recently finished class book – the masked mutant! Maths on the other hand





focused on geometry as we looked at simple nets and how these relate to 3D shapes.
