The children have been working hard on their physical development targets this week by doing some great physic exercises and working hard on their bodily and spatial awareness as well. In our P.E session on Monday afternoon, the children were great going through the obstacles with adult support and loved jumping on the trampoline during our Sensory circuit session on Tuesday.

We have had such a lovely time with our friends from Pink Class and Trinity Church of Abingdon on Tuesday morning. Our students did some great choosing between different colours and songs using different items, symbol boards and PODD books. Music is definitely one of our favourite ways to communicate with each other and our students have been amazing during their 1:1 sessions with Music Sheila. The children love to participate in intensive interactions with Sheila by vocalising, playing the piano or tapping the drums.

Green Class have had a fantastic time during Art activities on Wednesday morning. We all enjoyed making some great edible scented playdough using flour, cinnamon, salt, warm water, cream of tartar and cooking oil. We loved putting each ingredient in the big blue tray and using our hands to make different patterns and feeling the texture of each ingredient. Some of the children really enjoyed smelling and tasting the cinnamon powder as well. Our favourite part was when we added warm water to mix the ingredients and put them together. The children loved touching the warm playdough in the end, making fingerprints or handprints on it and particularly smelling the scent of cinnamon.

One of the most enjoyed lessons this week was science – we are looking at electricity this and next week and we had an exploratory session with circuit components, wiring in a light bulb or a buzzer. Everyone found this really exciting! We also had a great PE session with the whole class playing a team game together, and everyone worked really hard in swimming. A small group also walked to Abingdon and visited the museum before practicing ordering an item in a café.

In maths we have continued to work on addition and subtraction, with some of us practicing counting on and back and some of us using place value knowledge and resources to solve sums using two or three digits. In literacy we have been reading different myths and legends from India and Greece and breaking them down into their key features. In ICT we have continued to work on our keyboard typing skills, with Leythan and Richard completing the first level of Dance Mat Typing and getting their printed certificate – this is a free BBC touch-typing game and would be great for your children to continue working on at home.

Gold Class

Happy Friday all. This week in Gold Class we have been busy right across the curriculum!

In literacy we have begun working on myths and legends. We listened to and re-enacted the legends of 'Theseus and the Minotaur' and 'Jason and the Argonauts'. Through this we identified the key features of a myth and worked to spot these in the text. Playing 'Chinese Whispers' helped us to understand how a myth can change when passed on by word of mouth!





In maths we have been working hard at our addition. We used hands on and pictorial (drawn) methods in our work to practice 'counting-on' (rather than counting from 0) with some pupils, and to add two digit numbers with carrying for others.

In science we very much enjoyed making circuits with bulbs, buzzers and motors! Unfortunately there's always that one light bulb that never works, and poor Hayden must have found just about every single one!

In Topic we found out about Diwali; we played handball in P.E., and in ICT we practiced typing and touch-typing.
