Green Class

We hope you all had a lovely and sunny half term. Green Class students have had a great start to the new term and have really enjoyed playing outside and enjoying the sunshine. We have had so much fun on the field this week and the children definitely loved jumping on the outdoor trampoline.

Our topic for this term will be 'Let's explore (new beginnings, growing)' and we are all excited to use all of our senses and explore new exciting things, materials and activities. Our maths activities for this term will focus on exploring different shapes and especially the circle, the triangle and the square. The children have already started choosing their favourite shapes and exploring them this week. On Tuesday afternoon, we had great fun placing different shapes on a black card and then spreading lots of flour on the top. We loved watching the flour falling down through the sieve and seeing what shapes we have made on the card. During our phonics session this week, the children made colourful shakers using plastic water bottles, fabric, different colour paper cards, ribbons and rice. The children were so happy to shake them and make lots of loud and quiet sounds afterwards. In our Sensology session, we used our hands to touch and squeeze the blackberries and then we had a go at tasting some blackcurrant juice. Our students didn't seem very keen on the juice and their facial expressions during tasting were just amazing. Music Steve played his guitar on Thursday morning and sang some exciting anticipation songs to our students. The children definitely had a great time and especially loved the 'rain song'.

We have all had a great week starting our new topic about exercise, sports and our bodies.

In literacy we have been looking at different items from basketball games i.e. medals, t-shirts and trainers and writing and making captions about these.

A highlight of the week was definitely swimming. The children are all improving so much in both their swimming and their changing skills.

We are all looking forward our trip to the basketball pitch and the skate park next week.






News from Winter Cluster

White Class

New Beginnings is our topic for this term. We will be learning all about how plants grow and we will have a go planting our own seeds. To kick things off, our sensory story for the next couple of weeks is Jack and the Beanstalk. In Art, we explored using different 'plant' colours to paint Jack's beanstalk from the story. We loved mixing and swirling the paint and experimenting with the paint's thickness.



We've been going beanstalk crazy and in Numeracy we made our own papercraft beanstalks using card and tape. Later on, we used an informal method to measure how big they were.







All the beanstalks were big. Some were bigger. One was the biggest of them all at thirteen cubes in size!

We continue with our lesson favourites, such as Blue Baskets in the morning and turn-taking with toys in small groups. We have been improving our fine motor skills by using a knife to cut up fruit. Also, we have practiced spreading margarine and sprinkling cheese onto 'big' and 'small' crackers to make a healthy snack for Jack from our story.
