In literacy we have been writing a recount of Tuesday's events. Pupils identified the WHEN, WHO, WHAT, WHERE and WHY of different pictures in order to construct full sentences.

SRE has been very successful this week. All pupils have learnt to label external male and female body parts and know to use an anonymous question box in class if they have any questions between now and next week.

Structured physical activity is an important element of each day at school and we had a great PE session this week, showing a greater willingness to explore spaces at different heights. As part of our Communication curriculum in White Class, the children have been using PECS to select favourite outdoor activities such as bubble mix, giant building blocks and assorted balls. The children have settled well this first week back. Our focus for the next couple of weeks is shapes in Maths and farm animals in Topic, including talking about where our food comes from. So far we have made pink icing and watched it being dribbled onto little cakes as part of our Sensory Story, George and the Dragon.
