Green Class

Once again, this week the children in Green Class have been engaging fantastically in different activities. Green Class has been focussing on the Communication ILP targets and our students have had great fun choosing different toys, books and musical instruments during our Communication sessions. Some of our students have been using their IPads or their symbol boards to make choices and some others have been using their PODD books or photos to express their choices. We have all been impressed on how well the children are doing and how nicely they have been using their 'pointy fingers' to point to the right symbol or photo.

In Art activities this week the children have been exploring animals that live in the water, as part of our topic 'Water, water everywhere'. The students used clay, star shape or fish shape cutters and rollers to make some lovely clay starfish or fish. The children loved using their hands to feel the texture of the clay, make marks on it and they particularly enjoyed using the rollers to press down on the animal cutter of their choice. On Wednesday afternoon, the children also loved taking part in the Tennis Tournament that took place in the Big Hall. Green Class has been practising their Tennis skills every Friday morning this term and the children have showed great enthusiasm during the sessions.

We have also been very lucky this week, as Laura our Speech and Language Therapist visited Green Class on Tuesday afternoon and made our children smile and have a lot of fun. Laura brought her own Attention Bucket to our Class and showed us some very exciting toys that Green Class students really enjoyed. The highlight of this session was definitely the Attention Builder activity, as our students were encouraged to hold a transparent umbrella as Laura poured water over it. We have absolutely loved our literacy lessons this week - donning our drama hats and investigating play scripts. In Maths we have been investigating division in the context of fractions. Using visual fraction mats we have split up objects around the mat to find fractions of different amounts. Higher

ability pupils have been using this as a means of developing some division strategies.

Our Art work has also really started to come together this week as we have now begun to combine some of the different elements that we have been working on to create a bigger, multi-media piece.

SRE was also good fun this week. Some of our more mature students enjoyed giving each other a tough time in a humorous manner as they debated how many children is a good number of children for a family. We also invited the school nurse to join this older group as we talked about how to control a family's size.

On Wednesday we enjoyed sharing P.E. with Red Class as we held a mini tennis tournament and our topic lessons have seen us

investigating the desert habitat and plants that live there. Helen's prickly pet cactus certainly shocked a couple of pupils!

Homework

Part of our work on playscripts this week involved looking at 'stage directions' and how the actors should act. Use adverbs: are they speaking loudly, quietly or perhaps even angrily. For maths, please help your child to find halves/thirds or quarters of different amounts. This is closely tied to the work they have done on division e.g. 'To find a half we need to share between two.' 'To find a quarter we need to share between four'.

We would like to invite you to an important multiagency workshop to learn about the new partnership arrangements which will be implemented from September 2019 to safeguard all children who are or at risk of, or are being, exploited.

At the workshop you will learn about the new exploitation screening tool and the two main operational forums designed to deliver this work:

•Children at Risk of Exploitation Network. A multi-agency prevention network to discuss children at risk of exploitation who are not open to Children's Social Care (CSC)

•Children Missing or Exploited Panel. A panel who will discuss children who are currently open to CSC that have either gone missing and/or are being exploited.
