Gold Class

Happy Friday all! There's good news and bad news today: we are now only three days away from our summer holiday however, that also means that this is our last weekly newsletter of the year!

This week we have kept the pace going but have begun to wind down in some of our subjects. Pupils loved our trip to Wittenham Clumps on Monday and participated whole heartedly, racing (or even rolling) down the steep hill, playing 'Sardines' in the woods and 'Pooh Sticks' at the river.

In literacy we have kept things simple this week with some writing challenges and speaking and listening activities. Pupils independently wrote a short story, rolling a dice to choose plot information, and later in the week showed off their ability to blag when we played 'Just a Minute' and asked them to talk about a silly topic set to a countdown timer.

In Maths we have looked at coordinates, starting simply with gridded coordinates such as (A,1), (B,2), before moving onto simple coordinates involving an x and y axis e.g. (7, 5), where the first number is the x axis and the second the y. We enjoyed looking at treasure islands and coordinate pictures and all pupils were able to access the game 'Battleships' calling out coordinates to sink opponents' ships.

In topic we have prepared for our trip to the living rainforest by comparing the UK to what the environment might be like in a rainforest area. Pupils watched a BBC documentary clip in class before solving related questions and tasks.

We have now had our final art and ICT lessons and have also concluded our swimming although one group had to miss it due to our cluster assembly on Wednesday; thanks to all those that were able to attend. Well done also to the meal-project pupils who planned and prepared such an outstanding spread for our three executives!

I think the only thing left to do is to thank you all for such a marvellous year. You have been superb and it has been a pleasure working with you all. We look forwards to seeing you all in September, refreshed, tanned? and raring to go no matter where you may be.


