Stories, Songs, and Poems:

•Fiction Book: Little Red and the Very Hungry Lion is a non-fiction text that will develop the children's curiosity into animals that live in the Jungle.

•Non-fiction Book: Look at the most popular Jungle Animals — Helping the children explore the facts about the animals that live in the jungle and where they live and what they eat and how they survive.

•Poem: Jungle Jamboree—Incorporated into our daily routines to build language and understanding.

•Phonics Reading: We will continue with our RWI program, focusing on Set 1 sounds and blending skills. Children will also engage in daily phonics games and activities.

Communication and Language:

- •Daily routines such as Good Morning and Good Afternoon time.
- •Attention-building activities like Mr. Tongue and Attention Bucket.
- •Encouraging the use of communication.

Geometry, Number and Measure.

In Maths this term the children will develop their knowledge and understanding of 2D and 3D shape, exploring them in different ways, beginning to name them and to understand their properties. The children will respond to verbal cues, "Show me the circle". Some children will develop their skills further and be able to draw some of the common 2D shapes independently. The children will also explore and encounter ordinal numbers and begin to count more accurately to 10, they will also begin to recognise a numeral by name and develop their understanding of the value of a number out of sequence. The children will finally look at measure and will explore a range of objects of differing sizes, weight and volumes and engage in activities to compare size.

Other Curriculum areas: Cooking, Science, PSHP, Music, Careers, Art Geography, DT and RE.

Theme: In the Jungle

This term, we will be learning all about animals that live in the jungle. The children will be learning their names, where and how they live and what they eat.

Art: The children will experiment with multi-sensory art and will handle a range od drawing and modelling tools. They will be encouraged to independently select the appropriate materials and media for a set task. The children will be creating animal shapes using pasta, then explore a variety of different materials that are found in the jungle and explore painting over these materials. The children will also draw animal outlines using different tools in shaving foam and other sensory resources.

Music: Engaging with songs related to jungle music, rhythm activities and call-and-response games. The children will expand their knowledge of rhythm and engaging with different sounds through a range of multisensory activities. The children will have the opportunity to respond to sounds and to explore sounds coactively in different contexts.

Cooking: In cooking the children will design and make edible product-based foods using prior knowledge of skills and taking the independent approach to select the correct tools and use them in the correct way. The children will be designing Tiger's Mane platter, Jungle Snake sandwiches and will make crocodiles out of cucumber. The children will have the opportunity to explore and experience a wide variety of foods.

PSHE & Life Skills:

Exploring rules and being able to understand and follow the rules in the school environment. The children will be looking and developing their knowledge of the people who help us in school and looking at the different pet's families may have and how they care for them.

Science

In Science the children will experience and encounter a range of objects and activities within their local environment. They will encounter living things, plants and mini-beasts. They will be learning that all animals eat, drink, breathe and grow. They will develop their knowledge their understanding and name a variety of common and wild garden plants and will be able to describe the structure of a variety of common flowering plants including trees. The children will also be learning about the names of common animals, and which live in the wild and which live on a farm.
