

Functional English: Pupils will continue to work on their individual literacy targets throughout the week, including through joining their ability groups for Read, Write Inc. Phonics sessions. We will continue writing for functional purposes, such as timetables, shopping lists, recipes etc. We will cover the different special events and themes during the term (see below), involving varying differentiated literacy activities.

Functional Maths: Pupils will use their mathematical skills practically throughout the week in various everyday life activities, as well working on their individual Maths targets during designated Maths sessions. We will continue our work on numbers, sequence of numbers and solving a range of maths problems. This term we will also be learning about fractions and time.

Enterprise and Vocational:

Mini Enterprise:

This term, pupils will develop their creative skills by making items to sell. They will also run a small café for teaching staff, taking orders for burritos and preparing and delivering lunches during Friday cooking sessions.

Trips:

Pupils will have regular opportunities to go shopping, access local leisure facilities and visit Millets Farm, supporting their independence and community engagement

Other Curriculum areas:

ASDAN:

Pupils will complete modules on caring for the environment and being part of the community. They will continue with class job rotas, support other classes and take part in new activities linked to PE and Mini Enterprise. Work towards ASDAN accreditation will continue.

PSHE:

This term's focus is *Diversity, Rights and Responsibilities*. Pupils will learn about their rights in different situations and begin to understand responsibilities within school and the wider community.

Nature Nook:

This term, pupils will regularly visit the school's Nature Nook to explore the area, recognise tools and materials, and take part in gardening activities. They will help prepare the space for planting and continue working towards a gardening award, moving from Level 4 to Level 5.

Theme (including Geography):

Pupils will learn how to care for and grow plants. They will read books about gardening and continue to develop practical skills through ongoing work in the Nature Nook.

Careers:

Pupils will create items to sell, such as soaps and pottery dishes, developing enterprise skills. They will also explore future opportunities and discuss the types of jobs they may be interested in.
